**Treasurer's Report – Randy Roffina**

The budget includes items through the end of January 2018. Line items were added for CMS Musical items, and equipment donations made by CPAB.

**Membership Report – Joanne Howden**

Donations are currently \$11,440, which are lower than last year.

**Breakfast with the Musicians – Jean DiTanna**

Presale tickets are on sale now through Community Pass for the March 3<sup>rd</sup> fundraising event. Planning for the event is nearly complete. While the Key Club students will be helping with the event, adult volunteers are still needed.

**Performing Arts Update – Dr. Klemp**

On February 21<sup>st</sup> at 7pm, funded by a CEF grant, Mozart Requiem will be performed by the CHS choirs and CHS Chatham Orchestra, and will include CHS music faculty on select instruments. The performance will take place at the Chatham United Methodist Church and will include a pre-performance lecture by Mozart historian, Dr. Vincent Rufino. CHS art classes have created art inspired by the music, which will be digitally displayed throughout the performance

**CHS Musical – Jill Horowitz**

Fiddler on the Roof will take place March 22-24, 2018. The musical will feature a large on stage orchestra. Family pre-sale ticket sales will begin March 7<sup>th</sup> and tickets will go on sale to the public on March 12<sup>th</sup>. The Senior Citizen's dinner has been moved to the CMS cafeteria as a result of the CHS auditorium renovation.

**Broadway Under the Stars – Jessica Green and Jen Clarke**

Broadway Under the Stars, on February 2<sup>nd</sup>, was well attended with 173 total tickets sold, compared to 144 tickets last year. There were 64 student tickets sold this year at \$10 each, with the remaining adult tickets at \$20 each. Coordinators were pleased with the student turnout as a result of a lower ticket price. Revenue this year from the event was \$2,670, which was \$780 less than last year, as ticket prices were reduced to increase interest in the event.
